Medic Mentor have just launched Allied Healthcare Mentor, to support all aspiring healthcare students with work experience opportunities during the pandemic. Students now have access to their own specific work experience programme that will be highly relevant to the following healthcare careers:

Nursing, Midwifery, Paramedics, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Radiographers, Art, drama and music therapists, Dietitians, Operating Department Practitioners, Radiographers, Podiatrists, Osteopaths, Orthoptists, Prosthetists and orthotics, Speech and language therapists.

Astronaut Tim Peake will be taking part in an exclusive free virtual Q&A session for young people on Thursday 21 January 2021, from 5-6pm GMT.

In an exclusive session Tim Peake will answer questions submitted by young people (aged 11-18).

Young people can submit their questions in advance about Tim's time at the International Space Station, his chances of joining NASA's Artemis Program to return astronauts to the moon by 2024, plus STEM careers and opportunities in the space industry.

Army

The Army has many different careers available for people wanting to join. The types of roles available are: Combat, Engineering, HR and Finance, Intelligence, Communications and IT, Medical, Logistics and Support and Music and Ceremonial.
