Welcome to the latest edition of this newsletter which has been designed to help students with their post 16 option choices. With virtual open events starting to take place it is very important that you research carefully whichever pathway you are thinking of taking. If you are unsure consider all the options open to you.

Here is a list of some of the things you should be thinking about now to help you decide your next steps.

- Think about the subjects you enjoy, are good at and research new subjects that will be open to you after Year 11.
- Attend virtual events to see what is being offered, making sure you look carefully at the subject content, if they suit your learning style, entry requirements and where they could lead to in the future. As you cannot physically attend colleges and 6<sup>th</sup> forms do consider the journey and if it is practical for to you to attend.
- If you have any questions, make a note of them to ask either virtually or later with a member of staff.
- Discuss ideas with your family, form tutor, subject teachers or the schools Careers Advisor.
- Use the careers software and information sites in the newsletters to help you research further.
- Once you have decided, start applying making a note of application deadlines. You can apply to more than one place.
- Most importantly have a backup plan.

### **Labour Market Information**

Labour Market Information (LMI) is used to help us understand what types of jobs exist and what the demand is for people to do these jobs, now and in the future. Understanding this information can help you to plan what career you would like to go into.

There are two widgets that have been designed for young people to provide an easy way to access and explore LMI.

**Careers Information, Advice and Guidance**

**Careerometer** – this can be used to compare key information about different occupations, salary, working hours and future employment prospects. <https://www.lmiforall.org.uk/cm2/index.html>
