How to Get a Job – Student Request

Job vacancies are advertised in a variety of ways. They can be online, via social media or through organisations and agencies. Part time vacancies can be found in shop windows, local papers or noticeboards. Some jobs are not advertised at all, so you need to ask around and use your contacts.

Once you have found a job you then need to apply. Again, employers may ask for a CV or they may have their own application process. This initial contact will be first chance you have to impress the employer. So, it's important to think carefully about how you present yourself.
